
# Zonta Team Building & Planning Retreat

### **Member Highlights:**

**Special Guest Speaker:** Marcie Woolworth, Zonta Area 2 Director, was the scheduled speaker but was unable to attend due to getting stuck in traffic. Dr. Michelle Aldrich, Assistant Director of Area 2, spoke in her place. Dr. Aldrich is currently finishing her first four-year term on the Cheyenne City Council, representing Ward III. She spoke about the importance of civic engagement, encouraging activities such as:

We have received suggestions that information on future posters be presented in Spanish as well as English. Other feedback is welcome, as well.

### **OLD BUSINESS**

WyoGives: We received a total of \$1,142.63, which includes \$353.00 in matching funds.

Wing Shack Fundraiser: The restaurant had \$529.30 in sales linked to the "Empower" code. Our share of sales is not yet known. The original agreement was that the club would receive 10% of sales, but the owner has indicated it will be increased.
