## A Reminder to Stay Involved


As we move through this busy




## District 12 Governor's Seminar



## Hope Bag Donations requested

Please bring donations of items for our Hope Bag project to the December and January Zonta club meetings.

Now is a great time to add a few things to your purchases while shopping for Christmas or during the After Christmas sales. A summary of items is included and a more detailed list is being emailed. We also provide gift cards from fast food restaurants and grocery stores.

People in crisis from sexual assault leave the hospital without clothing, personal care items, and many times with no means to pay for a meal. Our Hope Bag project provides the forensic nurses at CRMC a way to give them help and hope.

For babies/children, women, and men: all sizes of sweat pants, t shirts, underwear (including sports bras) and flip flops or slippers are needed. Other items include tooth brush/toothpaste, comb/brush, small soap, travel size shampoo/conditioner, sanitary pads or tampons. Fleece blankets and gift cards in \$20+ are also needed to provide victims with dignity and support after medical examinations.

## Zonta News: Girls Are Enouigh

Growing up, I heard comments like "Why are you so boyish?" This is a common experience; a familiar part of girl-hood, being told to conform to certain expectations. While the words and questions may differ, the underlying message is consistent: you are not enough. It is also a message that follows us when we become adults.

According to a report by Heart of Leadership, girls constantly suffer from pressure and perfectionism:

- 74% of girls say they feel pressured to please everyone.
- 98% of girls are under extreme pressure to look a certain way. In the past years, the percentage of girls who report feeling confident has <u>dropped from 68% to 55%</u>.
- Only 4% of women consider themselves to be beautiful.

We need to change the narrative.

On International Day of the Girl, hundreds of Zonta members worldwide shared messages of what they were told as children and what they wished they were told instead. This global campaign showed that these negative words have a lingering effect regardless of the generation, background, or community we come from. But, as Zontians, we envision a world where girls can live up to their full potential and we must reject these negative narratives forced upon them.

Now think about the negative messages you have heard growing up and what you wished was said instead. Then, ask yourself what you want to say to future generations. Will it be a message of hope?

Right now, she's making Bull Fighting Shirts, Wild Bags, cosmetic bags, mini wallets, Kleenex covers, hot pads.
